Each site is approximately 6 metres wide by 4 metres deep. Site fees for the 2025 festival have been set at the following rates:

Food Trade Sites: \$150.00

Powered Sites: \$10.00 additional charge (limited power available)

Each stall will be issued with one complimentary gate pass, and one additional pass is available for \$5.00. If required, additional passes are available at a cost of \$25 per person.

The Festival Gates open at 7am, please stay and trade until at least 10.00 pm

For setup purposes, it would be appreciated if stallholders could set up on the Friday beforehand as there is plenty of security at the festival site during the night.

As there are a limited number of sites available, the attached application form and site fee/s must be returned before Friday 20th December 2023 to secure your site at the festival.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Site Size:- All sites will be a standard size of 6 meters frontage x 4 meters deep unless otherwise specified on the application form.
- Food Stalls: - \$150 per unpowered site. Applications close Friday 20th December 2023.
- Powered Sites (food & retail):- \$10.00 additional charge (limited powered sites available)
- Gate Passes:- One festival pass will be issued to the stallholder applicant. Stallholders may purchase **one only** extra pass for \$5.00, any additional passes required will be charged at \$25.00 each.
- As site numbers are limited and to ensure you obtain a site, the application form, and site fees must be received before the due date via the following methods.

 - Please complete and return the compulsory Fire Brigade documents and return with application and stallholder fee.
 - Refer to check list provided in the final page of the package.
- Site numbers and receipts will be posted / emailed approximately 2 weeks prior to the festival date.
- Please enter the festival site via gate 2 / Hunter Street east (south side of IGA).
- For setup purposes, it would be appreciated if stallholders could set up on the Friday before the event as there is plenty of security at the festival site during the night.
- For those who can't setup the day before to the event, the festival site gates will open at 7am on the morning of the festival.
- All sites are to be setup by 9.30am. Sites are to remain open from 9.30am until late.

- All vehicles that are not contained totally within the site and are not an integral part of the display or stall, must be relocated to an approved parking area outside the town green prior to 9.30am. There is free parking at the Recreation reserve.
- All food stallholders must have a working fire extinguisher on their site.
- All equipment must meet the Victorian Energy Safe requirements.
- All power leads need to be in good working order and be tagged.
- Any stallholder who is responsible for the safety switches being tripped, will have their power supply disconnected.
- The following items are banned from sale at the festival. There is no exception to this list: -
 - Any firearm, replica firearm or toy guns of any description. (This includes water pistols and cap guns).
 - Any knife or bladed weapon that is banned by state laws.
 - Stink bombs and cans of silly string.
 - Any other prohibited weapons / items that are banned by state laws.
 - Please Note: Local police may be contacted if any breaches of state laws are detected by festival staff or security staff.
- No Dogs are allowed within the festival site. All Pets are excluded from the festival grounds due to Health and Safety regulations.
- No push bikes, roller blades, roller skates or skateboards are permitted on the village green during the event.

CFA PERMIT APPLICANT'S USER GUIDE

CFA Permits Explained

There **two types** of permit:

1. **Fire Danger Period** permit - A permit that is valid for use during the declared **Fire Danger Period** but **NOT on Total Fire Ban Days.**

Who can apply for a Fire Danger Period (Schedule 14) Permit?

There are no limitations on who may apply for a permit for use during the Fire Danger Period.

2. **Total Fire Ban Day** permit - A permit valid for days of **Total Fire Ban** only.

Who can apply for a Total Fire Ban (Section 40) Permit?

Only the following may apply to be considered for a permit for a day of Total Fire Ban:

- Community organisations
- Charitable organisations
- Fundraising organisations
- Statutory corporations
- Councils
- Industrial or trade operations

Applications for a Total Fire Ban day permit can only be considered for **specified purposes.**

Specified purposes:

- Carrying out necessary work / business activity
- Public Entertainment
- Religious or cultural purposes

What type of activity requires a permit for using fire in the open air?

The below table provides a guide only. Please contact your CFA District Office to discuss any aspects that you cannot determine from this guide or if your activity is not listed. How do I apply for a FIRE DANGER PERIOD permit and/or TOTAL FIRE BAN day permit?

1. Fill out the Schedule 14 (FDP) and/ or Section 40 (TFB) application form, explaining why it is necessary for you to use fire in the open air during the Fire Danger Period or on a day of Total Fire Ban.
2. Return your form, with all sections fully completed, to the local CFA District Office.
3. If you are applying for a permit to allow you to operate throughout the *Country Area of Victoria**, send your form back to CFA Headquarters PO Box 701 Mt Waverly Vic 3149.
4. Lodge your form with CFA early. Permit management processes and inspections, if required, may take some time. Regular applicants should aim to lodge their forms by September each year.
5. CFA will notify you of its decision in due course. Permit applications may not be assessed until close to the time the work is to be conducted. This is so the weather and local conditions can be assessed. CFA's operational activity may also delay permit application processing.

*The *Country Area of Victoria* may include outer metropolitan Melbourne suburbs but does not include the MFB Fire District, any forest, national park or protected public land. If you are not sure about the location you may need a permit for, please check the boundary on the orange key maps at the front of a Melways or contact CFA Headquarters on (03) 9262 8444.

IMPORTANT NOTES

a) Tell us if you are using your permit

If you have been issued a permit by CFA, please ensure you ring the District Office relevant to where you are going to operate, on each occasion you intend to use the permit. A contact list will be sent to you if a permit is granted.

b) If you are burning off

If you have been issued a planned burn or 'burn-off' permit by either CFA, or a Municipal Fire Prevention Officer, you need to give the Emergency Services Telecommunications Authority (ESTA) prior notification by phoning 1800 668 511. Notifying ESTA about planned burns prevents unnecessary fire brigade response. Callers reporting an actual fire can then verify that the fire is a planned burn. If this can't be verified a fire brigade will be responded.

c) Formal information you need to know

- Permits are **not** automatically granted. CFA may assess your application and determine not to issue a permit.
- If granted, the permit holder must abide by all conditions that are set out in the permit.
- Applicants should be aware that CFA may revoke any permit issued if deemed necessary.
- Applicants should be aware that being granted a permit does not release them from liability or potential prosecution.
